May 1, 2019 BCC Room in Steamboat Springs**

In old business, Leona gave a report on LDC from back in January, Alivia gave a report on the Fiber Arts Camp, Jaycee talked about 4-H Ski Day. Beef weigh in was discussed with the group, led by Larhae and Leah, and the recap of District Retreat followed, led by Tommy and Lloyd. We talked about needing more sponsorships for fair and exhibit day awards. In new business, the new 4-H project of sportfishing was presented as well as an introduction to the new cloverbud workshops that are being put on by the Routt County Jr. Leaders. Club reporters were reminded that they need to send in reports to be eligible for an outstanding club at the end of the year, as well as we talked about animal housing forms and where to find them. NW Colorado Livestock Expo is being held here in Routt County June 10-14, and it is the 50th annual. We discussed camping reservations and the FM Light and Sons Ag Experience. Finally we voted on two important issues. The first, we decided to move all further council meetings to a time of 6:30 pm instead of 7. This change was approved by Jess and seconded by Justin.
