PROJECT OBJECTIVES:

1. Encourage members to learn about goats, including parts, nutritional requirements, different body organ systems, and more.
2. Identify different diseases that affect goats.
3. Learn how to keep detailed records and responsibly raise animals.
4. Members can raise market, breeding, utility, or dairy goats.

PROJECT REQUIREMENTS:

- **Club Participation** including attendance at monthly club meetings, community service, and a completed demonstration is needed to complete the project.
- **Interviews** will be available for members to participate in during the Routt County Fair. These interviews will take place the Wednesday of the Routt County Fair.
- **Showmanship** all members are required to show their animal at the Routt County Fair. All members are required to show in showmanship, and can show in breeding, utility, dairy, and market classes depending on their project and the goals they have set.
- **Record Books** must be completed with your projects. These books will be turned in to the Routt County Extension Office in September.

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
