




What is your involvement in 4-H (you can pick multiple answers)?
25 responses




How many years have you been involved in 4-H?

Survey Overview:


- 26 Responses (majority parents, followed by volunteers, youth, and families).



- *Encourage mentorship on a club level*


Project Workshops: Requests for record book help, horse clinics, small animal showmanship, needle arts, cooking, and mentorship program. Concerns on awareness of workshops.




- It was good but could use more communication, especially for new members.




- I have not heard anything regarding how shooting sports completion went.

JUDGES:

- Judges need to be vetted to discourage selecting those that have ties to the community. Selecting judges who themselves, business partners and/or relatives are selling livestock to the

area should not be considered for the job. This creates a conflict of interest. Superintendents serving in a department that they have children/grandchildren/relatives/customers in is an extreme conflict of interest. The committees need to do their due diligence and vet these folks into proper departments.

- Create a group/board to select judges. Bring in HIGH quality judges for all species.
- The swine judge should not be brought back in the future since he has done his two year cycle. The beef, sheep, and goat judge did not do a good job. It felt like she let her prior prejudices and biases towards members play into her decisions in the breeding and market shows. Macy has not been out of 4-H as a member long enough because there were several members that she livestock judged with around the state still in Routt County 4-H. Routt County and Rio Blanco County livestock judging have strong connections. The fact that she picked heaviest to lightest for the beef and sheep shows is concerning because the weight characteristics are very different in terms of overall quality and finish. While she may have come with good recommendations, she did not do a very good job in the show. We should NOT have Macy back, and we absolutely have to get away from having judges on a two year cycle. Will the extension staff hear this?
- Judges should not be picked by parents of kids who show in the shows. It is unfair to all knowing that the judges are friends and not there to do a job. It needs to stop being a political game and taken seriously because it is an obvious problem with certain families.
- Get a new judge for beef, goats, and lamb show. Find a judge that hasn't jackpotted with most of the beef kids.
- There really needs to be a committee that chooses judges for each species that isn't the superintendents as many of them have kid competing in such species. It makes the most sense to have individuals more in tune to today's standards and not 30 years ago. I would suggest now that the Rods no longer have kids competing and have more knowledge of current judging standards they would be a fantastic place to start or even looking up which college teams are doing well and reach out to their coaches. Macy the recent collegiate Judge did fantastic and made sense. It was nice that she wasn't contradicting herself every 10 words. The others not so much.
- The beef, goat, sheep judge was not consistent.
- It seems this gets brought up every year and never addressed. JUDGES!! A committee of sorts should be used to pick and choose judges! That is the whole purpose of the show and what the kids are working for and they shouldn't be short changed on this. In Routt County we have some really good connections to the show world through past members in school or have gone through university judging programs, award winning judging team and coaches and many kids that jackpot all summer long. All of which do not have a child in the current program and all of which want to see these kids have a good quality show. It is unfortunate that we are not utilizing these avenues to produce much better judges. If it's funding for it I think that can be addressed also. I've heard money was being turned away in some areas (which on another level is crazy). The committee can work in many ways like you could have those with connections recruit and then bring some sort of resume or application or even just a list. And then have another group go through and choose or reach out to get a commitment. Or you could see if those connections we have would want to man the committee. Either way, the kids deserve better and they spend a lot of money, hours, hard work and there whole summer and the shows are supposed to be the pinnacle of this so as those running the show you should do better!

- There are concerns and thoughts regarding the importance of maintaining fairness, integrity and current market standards in the judging process at our County Fair. The County Fair is not only a cherished community tradition, but also an opportunity for our youth to demonstrate their hard work, skills, and dedication in an environment that reflects the highest standards of our industry. In order to ensure credibility, it is vital that the selection of judges and decision-making committees remain unbiased and free from potential conflicts of interest. When extension staff members, superintendents, or others with children in show ring participate directly in these roles, it can unintentionally raise concerns about fairness—even when everyone is acting with the best intentions. To preserve the trust of participants and the community, the process must not only be fair, but also seen as fair. Therefore, I respectfully recommend that committees and judges be comprised of individuals who: Have no direct family involvement with exhibitors in the current show. Are knowledgeable about current industry practices and show standards. Can evaluate projects based on merit alone, without influence from personal relationships. By following these guidelines, we can ensure that the competition is judged objectively, and that every exhibitor feels their efforts are being measured equally. This approach upholds the integrity of the Fair and helps prepare our youth for future opportunities, both in agriculture and beyond. Thank you for considering this matter with the seriousness it deserves. I am confident that with thoughtful planning, we can continue to provide a Fair, educational, and rewarding experiences for all participants.
- Stop letting 4-h kids' parents choose judges.
- *Cathy commented that the Dog Judge is always amazing*
- *We try to keep the process transparent, and we will never please everyone.*
- *Committee Discussion:*
 - *Use past 4-H members such as Tell Belton, Hallie Myhre, Emmitt Meyring (& Sage) to help recommend judges who are up to date on industry standards and un-biased rather than adults directly working with members/families.*
 - *Important to keep interaction with the kids at the top of the list, and make sure judges work well with the members.*
 - *If a committee is needed, we will look at using people who are in the industry but with no direct relation/connection to members and their families. Jeannie Logan would be available if needed.*

Set-Up/Tear Down:

- Expand the ring size for dog.
- I think it ran well except set up day. Kids need more guidance on what needs to be done photos etc.
- 5 ft of space is not enough room for your steer/ your blocking chute/ your feed / and all other supplies Electrical Outlets DO NOT Work / Blow Breakers Small Animal Barn / Top Row of Rabbit Pens should be used for Show Animals not Rabbits for Sale / Some kids had 5 or 6 pens of for Sale Rabbits!
- Try to figure out a way to keep all animal members in the barn for clean up until the end.
- *Start Clean-Up/Break Down Day earlier (8am) and have a system of members working through before breaking down pens*

- *Set-Up night before? Work with FFA to have a designated group of members to set up pens Tuesday night, and then younger members can come in on Wednesday to clean/wipe down and clean up fairgrounds – Wednesday night is somewhat attractive for families who have to work especially when parents are taking the whole next week off.*
 - *We need a better plan/map of the MPB so that everyone knows where things need to go.*
 - *Organize stalling so that clubs within the same area could be closer together.*
- *Small Animal Barn needs a point person for the day.*
- *Swine Waterers – look at phasing these out and requiring members to bring their own. OR is there someone who would like to take these on? Background, we used to have enough waterers for 80+ members, now we are down to under 35 waterers due to breaking/extended borrowing.*
 - *Look at phasing these out. Complete a Swine Water building workshop to help members build their own waterers for fair.*
- *Look at getting shavings from Saratoga Forest Management (509 E Bridge Ave, Saratoga Wy – office@saratogaqm.com).*

Rule Clarification:

- *Clarity needs to be made around the “no drenching” rule. If a no drenching rule is going to be in place it needs to be enforced to include the forced feeding of paste products like calf calm, probiotics etc. This rule is outdated itself but since outdated practices seem to be the norm and the rule needs to be in place it needs to be properly enforced. There is no difference in forcing liquids or forcing pastes.*
 - *We will not change the “no drenching” rule, as if it is done incorrectly it can severely hurt the animal. Look at making a distinction between drenching and giving approved pastes/electrolytes/etc.*
- *I think that for the horse show the kids should be able to ride in a side pull because I had a two year old this year and he wasn't really to go to a bit but I pushed him anyway because I couldn't ride him in a side pull.*
- *Should we allow more than 1 family animal for families with more than 2 kids? What could this look like? This will remain the same for now.*
- *Is it possible for 2 families (not related) doing a project together AND housing at the same location share a family animal? Neither member has a sibling doing the project, but want another animal in case 1 dies. – Becky moved to allow a “family animal” for two non-related kids who are raising animals together (as long as neither has a sibling doing the project and they are housed at the same spot). Deborah seconded, no opposed. Will go on to Council for members to vote on it!*
- *Move Breeding Animal IDs to be due by June 1st instead of July 1st. – Keep as is so members can have more time to find breeding animals.*
- *If a member refuses to participate in Round Robin, do they forfeit their award?*
 - *Discussed to make Round Robin required. Selina moved, Ashley seconded, none objected. Will move to Council for vote.*

Scheduling:

- This year was great. I show horses and I do think that the show and the gymkhana shouldn't be on the same day night year it was too long of a day for the horses and the kids.
- Might be nice to have the shows moved to the evenings so more community members are able to attend.
- Liked the swine show being later with cooler weather.
- The swine show ended up at the hottest part of the day. Last year, it was put at 5 p.m. to avoid the 3 p.m. time and make the public happy. We need to have the swine show in the morning (8 a.m. or 9 a.m.) to do what's best for the livestock.

Additional Comments:


- Many wonderful things happened this year.

- Let the parents be more involved. Encourage the parent to be involved with their kids. Have a parent show class. These kids need to know their parents care and want to help. Way to much disconnect from families – *We love this idea. We will be doing a Celebrity Show Class for parents to show after mini showmanship.*
- Change the Ag Experience. The club members don't like working it and it was very trashy this year. Attends is not that great after the first day and most of the people coming through would rather look at the turkeys in the back.



- *Dessert – add oatmeal*


Event Logistics

- *Note to have slicers keep slicing roasts until BBQ is over. Even if it means less roasts to auction at the end.*



(Grands/Reserves first), new backdrop needed, education for buyers on what members put in.


Jr. Livestock Sale - How do you feel the Junior Livestock Sale ran? If scoring below a 4, please provide feedback below.

Photos:

- The photographer has to do a better job of getting buyer photos ready after the sale.
- Need a new back drop for pictures. Photographer was great! Need to get pictures back a little sooner.
- Getting Pictures and Buyer List should not take 2 months. Our Add ON contributors complained that they hadn't gotten a thank you card yet and they weren't donating again.
- Sale Photos being delayed and lost was a bit frustrating.

Sale Order/Scheduling:

- The bbq needs to be over before the sale starts because people are still outside.
- I know the sale order will never change, but it would be nice to rotate every year. I am friends with the three auctioneers and think they do great, but would like to see each of them do each species. We know it's a lot of switching, but it would be more even for the kids.
- Champions drive before the sale
- Missing the parade of champions at the beginning of sale. Too many other small animals being sold at beginning pushing out the champions. They won the shows and should lead them do each species with small animals and sponsorship animals in between the different species. The champion animals are generally broke and can be taken easily to the ring and don't have to have the break down and put up for the whole line of species. With holding pen. Honor the animals that won and make sure the audience is there for them.

Auctioneer:

General Comments:


- *What are the rules/optics of selling a visibly injured lamb (i.e. hernia)*
